USING THE MAMA SHERPAS AS AN ADVOCACY TOOL

The Mama Sherpas can be used as a tool to educate, inform and mobilize audiences on issues surrounding maternal health, women's rights and access to high quality and affordable health care in the United States. The Mama Sherpas puts a lens on an evidence-based, collaborative care model that puts midwives at the center of women's health care. In conjunction with your screening event, we recommend focusing your call-to-actions on the following key issues.

Collaborative care among doctors and midwives in a hospital setting results in better outcomes for mother and child and reduces the number of c-section and unnecessary interventions.

Key Issues

- Ability for midwives to practice: full practice authority for midwives (state policy level)
- Access to midwives: shortage of midwives and midwifery training programs in the United States
- Promoting limited interventions and supporting natural birth in a collaborative care setting
- Misperceptions about midwifery care

Midwifery care reduces the cost of childbirth through judicious use of costly technology and by reducing c-section rates.

Key Issues

- Medical costs and "fee-for-service" payment models for birth
- Shortage of midwives and midwifery training programs in the United States
- Cultural misperceptions about midwifery care

VBAC births are possible and desirable for many women.

Key Issues

- VBAC bans in hospital systems (generally a hospital level policy)
- Misperceptions about the viability/safety of VBACs

Vaginal breech birth can be done safely in many circumstances.

Key Issue

 Lack of medical training and awareness of techniques to support vaginal breech births

Midwives are often on the front lines of poverty, providing low-income women with holistic maternal care.

Key Issues

- Ability for midwives to practice: full practice authority for midwives (state policy level)
- Access to midwives: shortage of midwives and midwifery training programs in the United States
- Misperceptions about midwifery care being only for certain classes of women

Giving birth is "normal" and images of birth should not induce fear, disgust or anxiety.

Key Issues

- Cultural taboos about images of women's bodies and birth
- · Altering prevalent media views of women in labor



The Mama Sherpas is a great way to introduce midwifery to a variety of audiences and raise awareness about collaborative care models and natural physiological birth.
